

Yesterdays and You

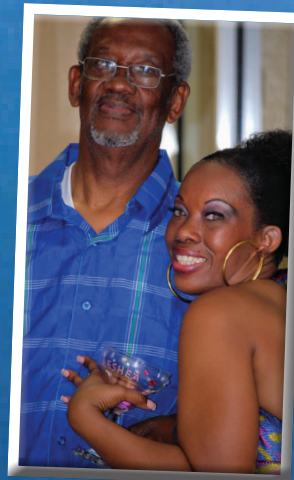
I remember yesterdays

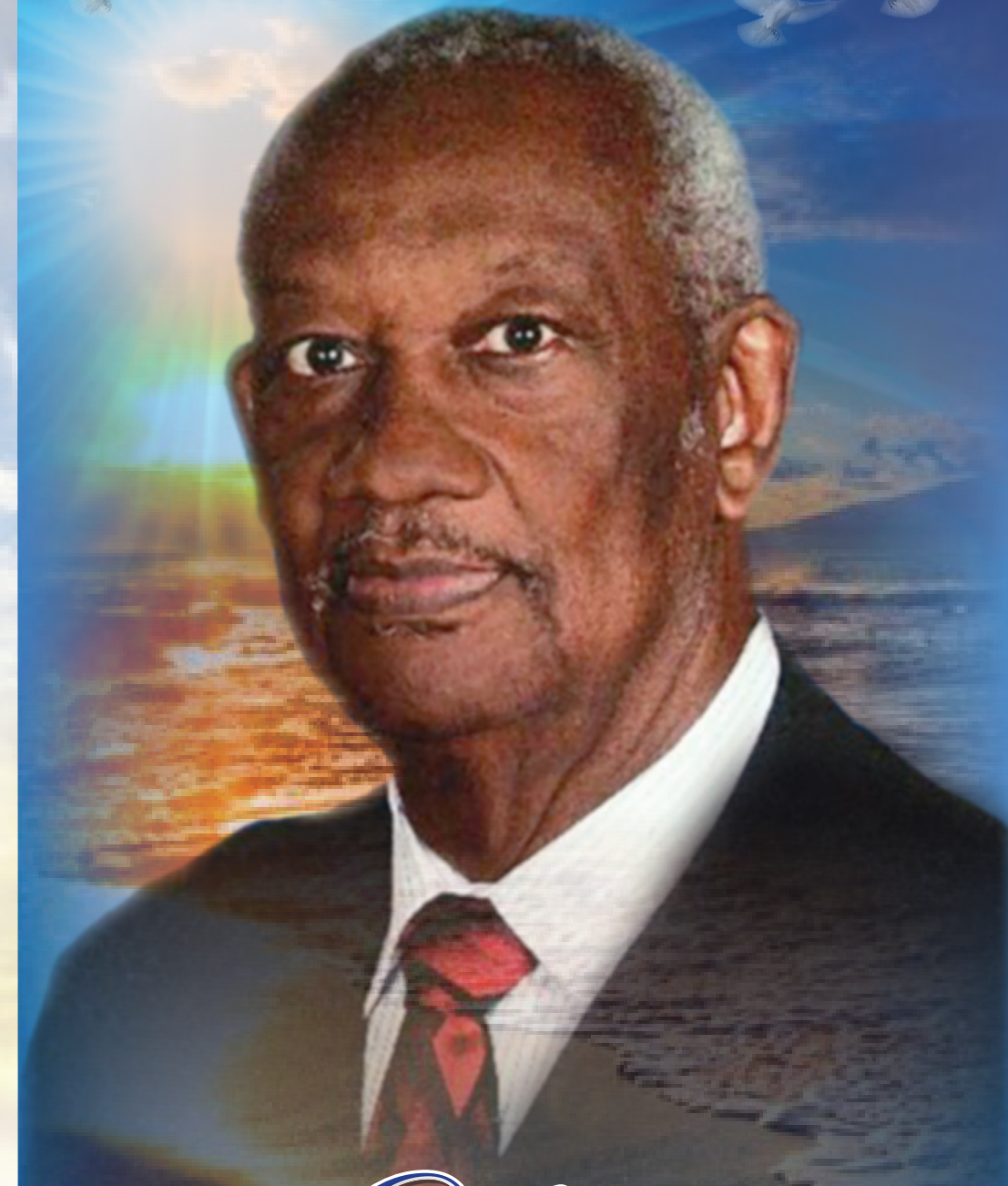

LEON OLIVER WILLIAMS was born in Jonesville, Florida on March 24, 1941, to the parents of Malvina Young Williams and Ike Williams both deceased. He was the youngest of eleven children.

At the age of three the family moved to Gainesville, Florida. Where he received his formal education in the Alachua County Public School System. He graduated in 1959, from Lincoln High School in Gainesville, Florida.

Leon began working while in high school in 1958 for Duncan Brothers Funeral Home, where he develop a passion for the funeral service.
