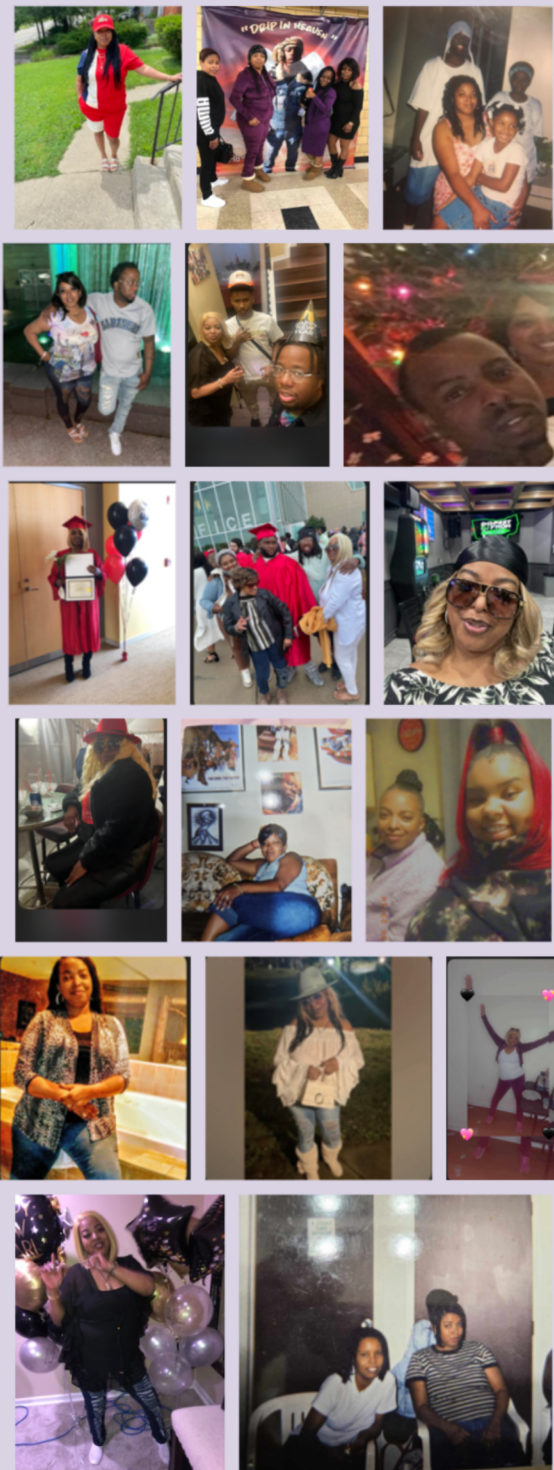


*Son Reco:*

*Mother Ava Lynn:*

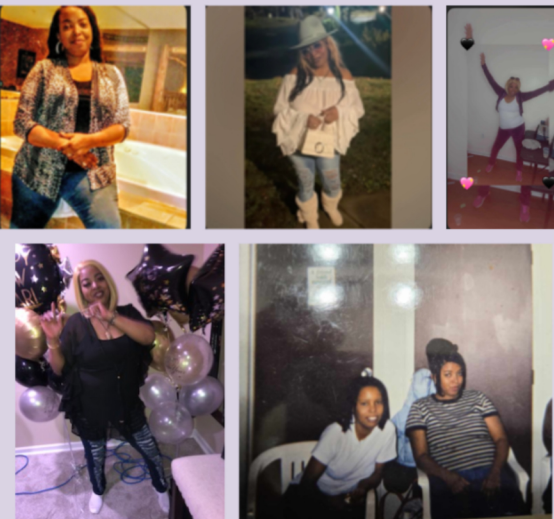
