I'll remember it a while.*

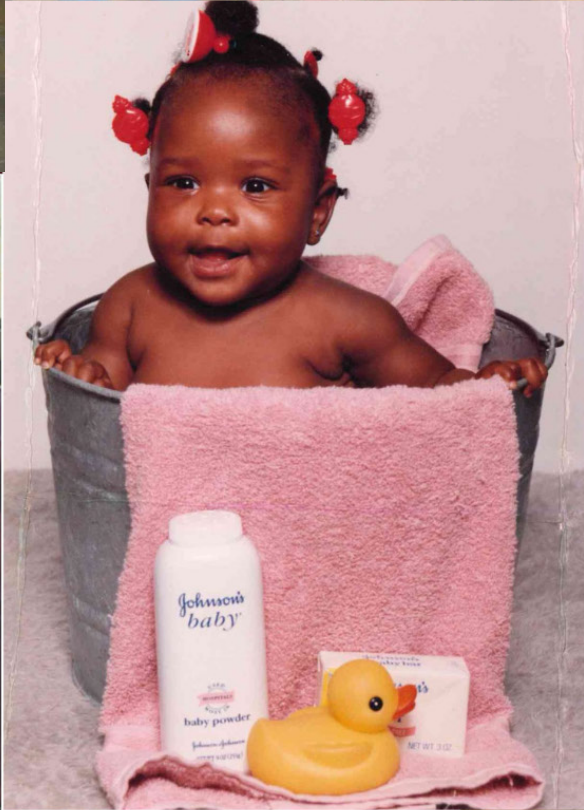
*For though you are no longer here,
You'll never be truly gone.*

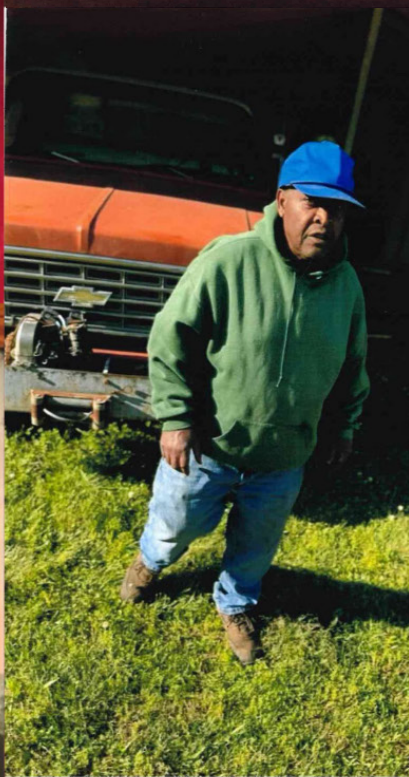
*So long as I have these memories,
