There was a quiet strength about Ms. Flossie Mae Jones—a woman of few words, yet a heart full of melody, memories, and meaning. Born on September 2, 1954, to the late Willie James Jones, Sr. and Mary Jane Wesley Jones, Flossie's life was a gentle yet powerful testimony of faith, resilience, and authenticity.

In the stillness of many days, you could find her sitting peacefully on the side of her mother's home, her voice softly carrying the timeless tune of A Change Is Gonna Come by Sam Cooke. It was more than a song to her—it reflected her spirit, her hope, and her journey through life.

Flossie cherished her faith and found joy in lifting her voice in praise.
