You'll be the heart I'm grateful for!

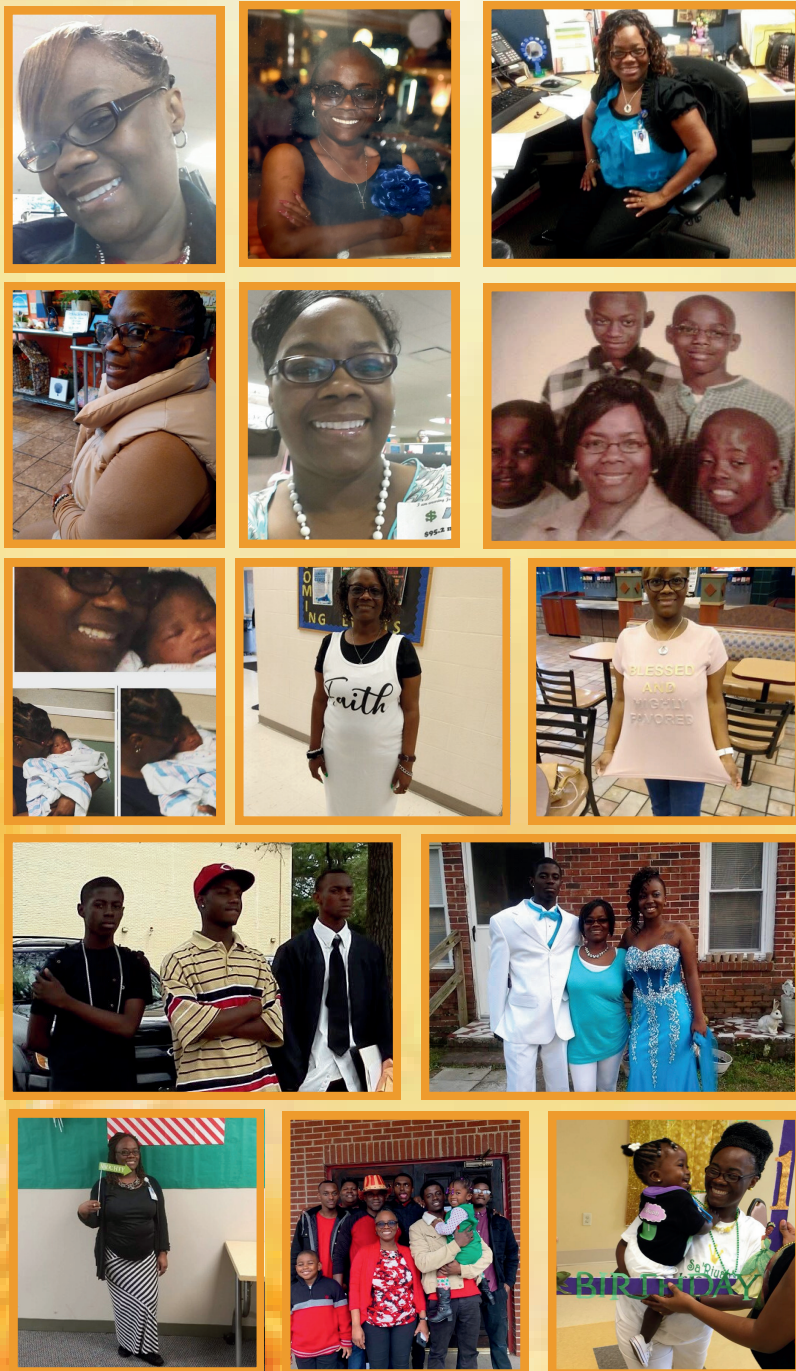
