Life Reflections


Our beloved mother and matriarch has joined the celestial choir. Ina C. Brogdon, age 82, affectionately known as Soloist Sister Clara Pringle the Ebony Singer, transitioned on March 8th 2026 at Prisma Richland Hospital in Columbia, S. C. Born in Hebron, S. C. August 2nd 1943, she was the daughter of the late Solomon and Fancy Burgess. She was the widow of the late Elder James A. Pringle & Willie Brogdon.

She attended the public school of Cades, South Carolina. At an early age Ms. Pringle accepted Christ and joined the family church, Hickory Grove AME in Hebron, S. C. After moving to Sumter S. C. in the early seventies with her four children, she joined the Cedar Grove Missionary Baptist Church here in Sumter and was a devoted member serving faithfully on the Senior, Sanctuary and Male Choir. She also served as a member on the Cedar Grove Senior Missionary Auxiliary.

Soloist Sister Pringle started singing at the early age of nine and continued to spread the love of God by singing and spreading the word through gospel music for over fifty years. She sung briefly as a lead singer with the Gospel group the Crown of Joy of Sumter, South Carolina. She later formed the Ebony Gospel Singers with her three beautiful daughters: Carolyn, Ann, and Brenda. After her daughters married and moved away, Ms. Pringle continued to sing for the Lord affectionately and was known in the community as Soloist Clara Pringle the Ebony Singer and The Voice, and that's the singing Lady Ms. Clara.
