After high school Jackie attended Ridgewater College in Willmar, Minnesota, for Cosmetology. Jackie lived and worked for a short time in Minneapolis before moving back to Alberta. She was united in marriage to Mark Holslin on February 10, 1990 at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Chokio. They made their home on a farm near Alberta where Mark and Jackie worked side by side and welcomed three children: Amanda, Justin, and William. When the kids were in school, Jackie would fill in as a paraprofessional at Chokio-Alberta schools.

Jackie was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Alberta and a member of the Alberta Wildlife Federation. She was a fan of watching football and participating in Fantasy Football leagues where she was either really good or really bad!
