Obituary

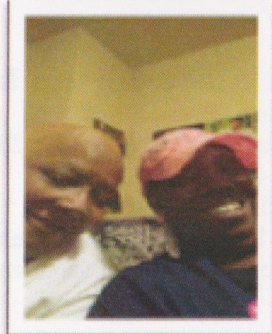
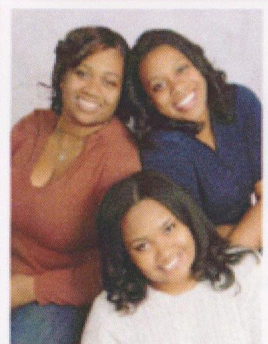
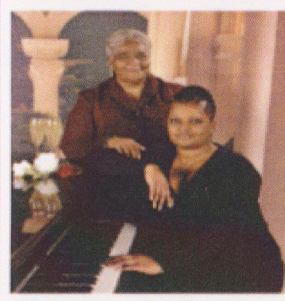
