Your service was honorable. Your life was meaningful. Your love was truly unforgettable.

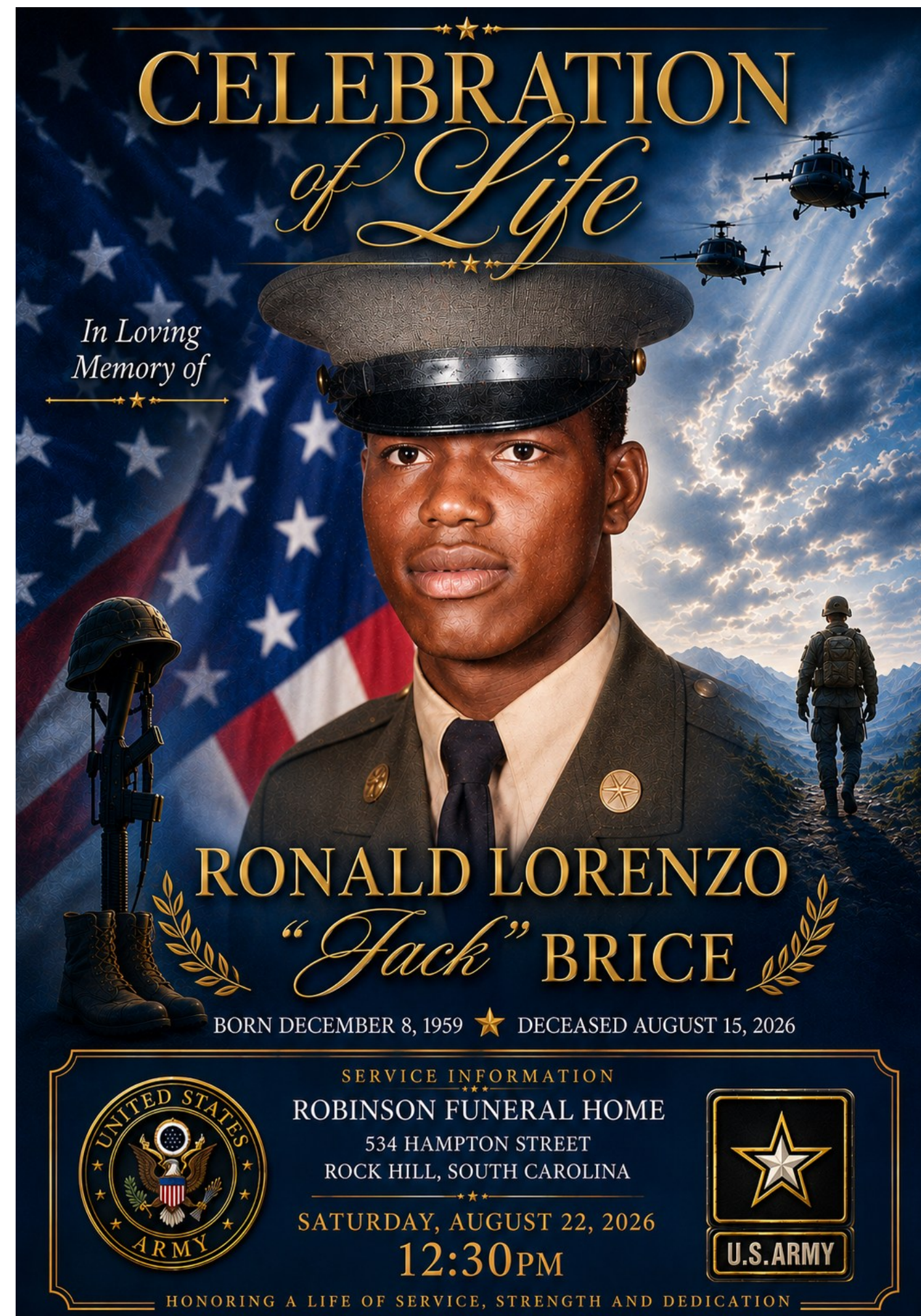
