Remembering My Beloved Son Jeremiah

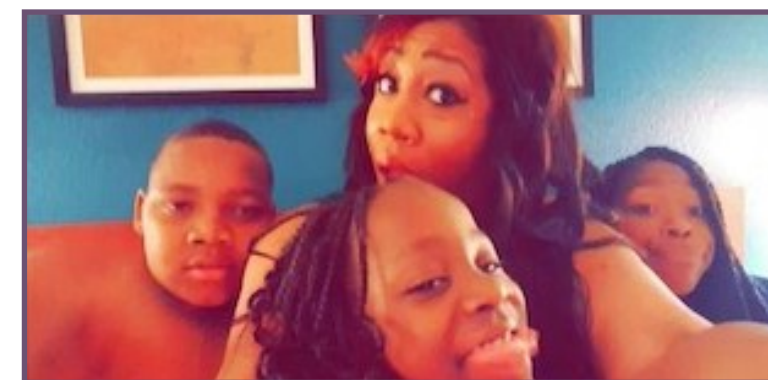
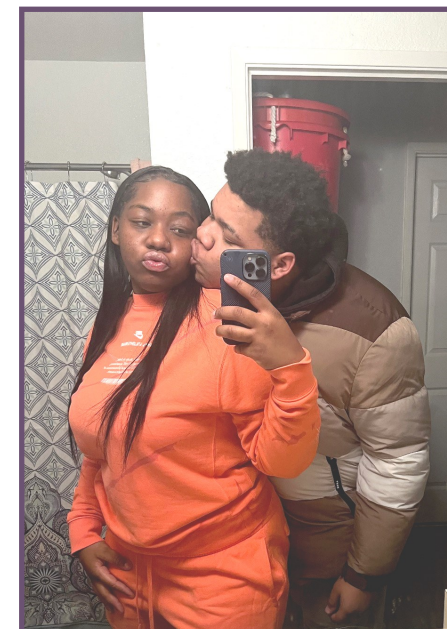
