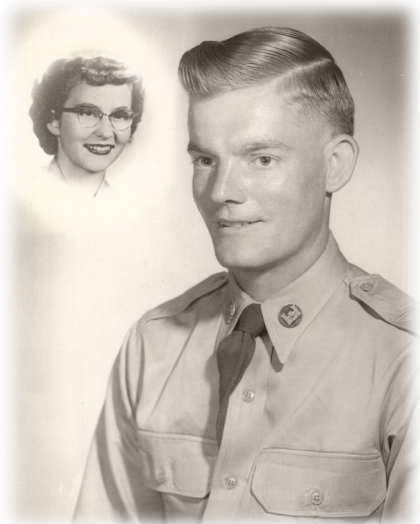

Harold Oliver Binde was born on May 2, 1932, in Waubay, SD. He was the son of Helge A. and Manda O. (Strom) Binde. Harold attended school in Summit and graduated from Summit High School with the Class of 1950.

Harold served in the United States Army,

enlisting in 1954. He was awarded the National Defense Service Medal and was honorably discharged in 1955.

Harold returned to South Dakota and was united in marriage with Shirley Steinocker on June 24, 1956, at Mazeppa Lutheran Church. They were blessed with 67 years of marriage and three children: Valorie, Laurie, and Brad.



Harold's career including working as a printer at Grant County Review in Milbank from 1957-1960; People's State Bank in Summit from 1960-1985; and Cave Supply Company in Milbank from 1991-2003. He served on the board of directors and as president of the Watertown Chapter of the AIB (American Institute of Banking). In 1983, Harold was selected, along with 30 other bankers, to represent the banking industry and our nation on an official People to People Mission to Russia and the Peoples Republic of China.

Harold was a faithful member of Hope Lutheran Church and served at various times on the church council, as council president, Sunday School Superintendent, Sunday School Teacher, and church treasurer. He had a beautiful voice and was honored to have sang at over 120 funerals. He served on the board of directors of the South Dakota Bankers Association. He enjoyed flying and held a private pilot's license.
