Obituary

Steven Bentley Hunter, Sr., was born on January 28, 1955, in Cincinnati, Ohio, to William Jr. and Elayne Hunter. He departed this life after a lengthy illness on July 10th, 2025.

Steve was a “Kennedy Heights Kid”. He was baptized at First Baptist Church of Kennedy Heights. He played knothole baseball on the RC Cola team (coached by his dad). He was part of KENSIL Sports. He loved dogs; he learned safe handling of firearms and household maintenance from his dad. He developed a love for music and learned to play the bass guitar, acoustic guitar, and piano at a young age. There was always band practice at the Hunter home. Two of his bands were ‘Generation Gap Band & Show’ and ‘Mama’s Pride Band & Show’. Steve also played locally with various artists.

Steve had a love of motorcycles and traveled the country on his bike. His work career started as a lineman at the then CG&E. At the time of his retirement in 2014, he was working in the Materials and Repair department. In addition to his work at Duke Energy, Steve served many years as Minister of Music at New Life Temple Church. There, he was instrumental in the CD release of “Don’t Let the Rocks Cry Out”, where he composed several songs for the project.
