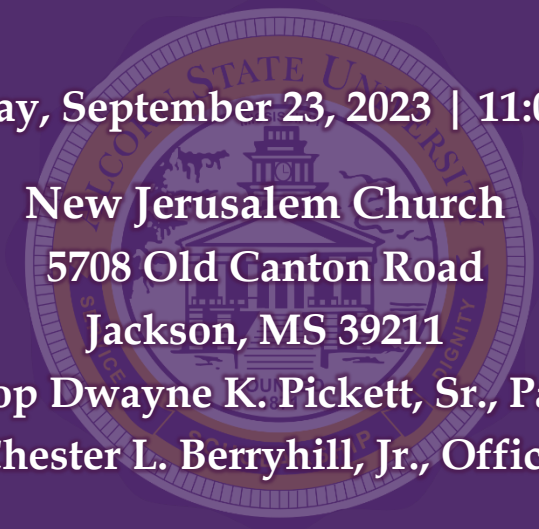

Adrian "AP" Price was born to Dorothy Jean Johnson-Price and Willie Earl Price on January 24, 1980, in Vicksburg, MS. Raised in Yazoo City, he was a lover of music and singing from a very young age and went on to play the "Quints" in the drumline and sing in the choir of Yazoo City High School before graduating in 1998. Upon graduation, Adrian was accepted to Alcorn State University where he obtained a bachelor's degree in criminal justice. While in college, AP was a proud member of the "Sounds of Dynamite" marching band and played the "Quads" in their drumline. Adrian Price was dedicated to service and took pride in protecting his country from foreign and domestic enemies alike. He began his military career in his junior year of high school and served for eight years in the Army National Guard Reserve during and after college.

Following his graduation, Adrian began his professional career as a Deputy Sheriff for the Warren County Sheriff's Department. Shortly after, Adrian decided to change careers and began working for Federal Bureau of Prisons in 2005, where he served as a correctional officer. He was, again, promoted to Correctional Counselor where he was responsible for the development and reentry of incarcerated males across the country. As a dedicated officer, Adrian joined the Disturbance Control Team (DCT), willing to put his life on the line, if need be, to protect his fellow coworkers and the community.

Not only did AP take great pride in his work, he was always happy to say that he met the love of his life "in prison" - a running joke between the two. Cyndee L. (Davis) Price and AP met when they were both Correctional Officers at the FBOP FCC Yazoo City in 2011 and were married in 2015. Cyndee and AP lived in Jackson, MS and raised three sons Arnaud, Chandler and Chace Price.

Adrian accepted Christ at an early age at Old King Solomon Missionary Baptist Church and as an adult, attended New Jerusalem Church in Jackson, MS with his family. He loved spending time with family and friends and was a strong supporter of his alma mater, Alcorn State's football team (which, of course, always made for fun banter with his wife, a Jackson State University alum!). AP loved playing with his children and teaching them to play the drums. His kind and caring nature touched everyone who knew him.

Adrian "AP" Price, a loving husband, father, son, brother, and friend was called home to be with the Lord on Thursday, September 14, 2023, at the age of forty-three. His tenacious battle with stroke complications demonstrated his courage in facing life challenges with steadfast strength and determination. He was proceeded in death by his parents and a sister, Tynisha Williams. He leaves behind his wife, Cyndee; three children, Arnaud, Chandler and Chace; a Godmother, Lavolia Cleveland, Chicago, Illinois; two brothers, Marius Price (Fatima Price), Sierra Vista, Arizona and Terence Williams, Atlanta, Georgia; sister Tara Williams, Yazoo City, MS; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins god-sisters and friends. He will be missed in this present world, but we thank God for his eternal victory.

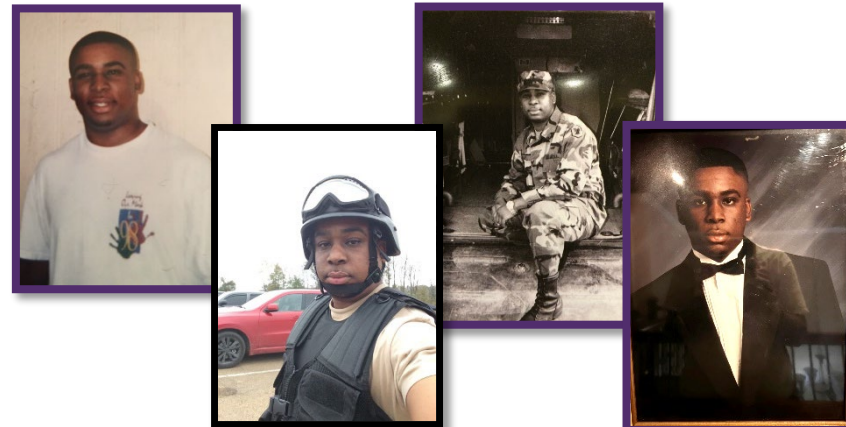
