# His Story



Randall White Jr. transitioned from this life on Thursday, March 26, 2026, at the age of 33. Born on May 7, 1992, in Beaufort, South Carolina. He was the beloved son of Sherrie Turner-White and the late Randall White Sr. He was preceded in death by his father; his paternal grandparents, Rudolph and Dorothy White; and his maternal grandmother, Elizabeth Turner.

Randall was a star football player, a cherished mentor, and a beloved family member. He graduated from Manchester High School in 2010 and went on to attend Waldorf University in Forest City, Iowa. Randall was a proud member of St. Paul CME Church.

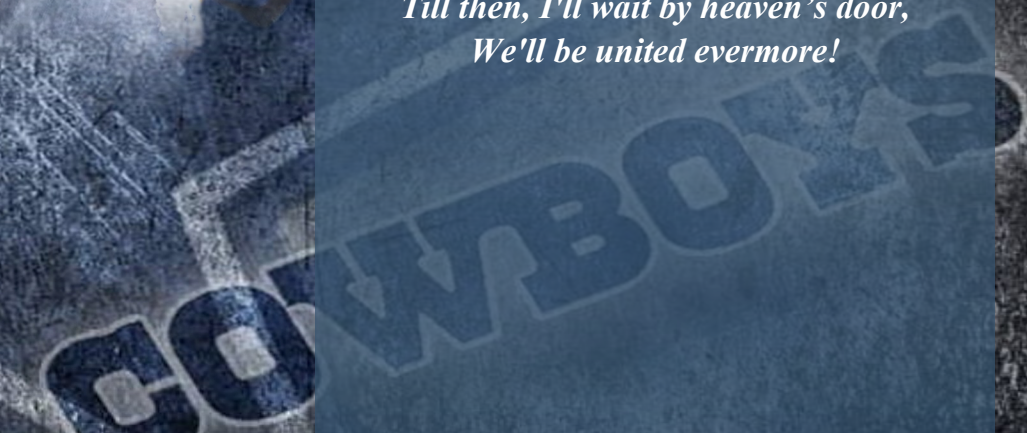
## Remembering Me
