Mother Irma Jean Manning was born on February 20, 1944, in Humphreys County, Mississippi, to the late Willie and Daisy LaBon. She was the sixth of fourteen children.

At an early age, Irma accepted Christ as her Savior and was baptized at Mount Horeb Missionary Baptist Church in Louise, MS under the leadership of Reverend Johnson. At the age of twenty-four, she relocated to Yazoo City, Mississippi, where she joined New Foundation MB Church in Holly Bluff, Mississippi. Later, she united with St. Matthew Church of God in Christ in Yazoo City, MS, under the leadership of Elder John H. Scott, Sr., where she faithfully served in the Outreach Ministry and remained a devoted servant of God and an active member until her health failed.

Mother Manning was the loving mother of eight children. In addition, she raised four bonus children from the previous marriage of J.D. Nutall as her own. Later in life, she was united in Holy Matrimony to Eddie Manning, with whom no children were born.

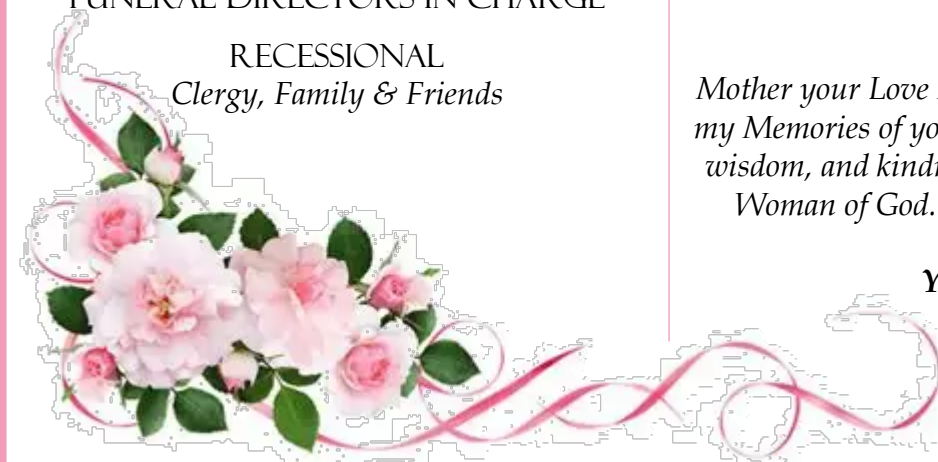
