LIFE REFLECTIONS

With grace, dignity, and a life defined by love and generosity, Vivian Therese Boone Sanders entered eternal rest in the early morning hours of Wednesday, January 14, 2026, at the age of eighty-eight. Born on November 17, 1937, in Summerville, South Carolina, to Joshua and Ermine Boone, Vivian was a cherished daughter, wife, sister, aunt, cousin, and friend whose presence touched countless lives. Affectionately known as “Nana,” Vivian was baptized at an early age at Brownsville Community Church of God. She was educated in Dorchester School District Two and graduated from Alston High School. She later attended South Carolina State College before beginning a distinguished career in telecommunications. Vivian worked as an operator for New York Telephone Company/AT&T for more than 30 years, first in New York City and later in the Charleston area after returning home to South Carolina. She retired in 1995, leaving behind a legacy of professionalism, dedication, and kindness.

Vivian met the love of her life William “Joe” Sanders in seventh grade while attending Alston High School. Their union was blessed with two daughters, Marsha Denise Sanders and Tammy Sanders Reynolds (Michael). Joe and Vivian shared 68 beautiful years of marriage, filled with adventure, laughter, and unwavering devotion. Vivian lived a life of service and community.
