Obituary

Barbara Ann Price was born on August 13, 1945, in Atlanta, Georgia, to Curtis and Ella Mae Price. The first of eleven children, Barbara was a born leader.

Barbara was an excellent student. She attended St. Joseph Elementary in the West End of Cincinnati where she was baptized. She continued her path of excellence, graduating from Our Lady of Angels High School. Barbara obtained her Bachelor of Science in Biology from the University of Cincinnati. She went on to earn her Doctorate in Podiatric Medicine from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio.

From an early age, she was a keen observer of the turbulent times. As a young adult, she became active in the social and political unrest of the 1960's. Barbara not only talked the talk but put action into words often putting herself on the front lines in the struggle for civil rights and racial equality. Coming up against all manner of physical and hateful verbal abuse, she participated in the protest and peaceful sit-ins some of which resulted in her arrest. It was during one such event while protesting against the unfair hiring practices of African American construction workers that she met her soulmate and future husband, the charismatic activist and local leader of the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) C.W. "Jimmy" Vinegar. On June 18, 1968, they united in Holy Matrimony. Their union lasted until his untimely death in October 2005.

Barbara was a loving, protective sister, and aunt to her many nieces, nephews, and grandchildren. Unhampered by her illness, Barbara continued to provide care and support for a family, friends, and patients in the community.

Barbara left this earthly realm on Wednesday, October 4, 2017. She was and will always be a bright and guiding light to her grieving family.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her daughter, Diane Vinegar, and her sister, Benita Price.

She leaves behind to cherish her memory, her children, Elaine Vinegar Ware, Timothy Vinegar (Peggy), and Michael Vinegar (Katherine); six sisters, Eloise Price Gordon, Jan Price Toler, Cora Price Miller, Bridget Price McKee, Carol Price Cook, and Lisa Price Mayes; three brothers, Curtis Price, Bradley Price, and Dino Price; loving Aunt Cora (Harrison Collins; uncles, Willie Eugene Harrison and Countee Collins; brothers-in-law, Tony Cook and Prentice Miller, and sister-in-law, Sharon Paige Price. She leaves behind a host of nieces, nephews, grandchildren, extended family members, and friends, too numerous to name.
