On November 16, 1948, Marshall Isadore Generette was born in Baltimore, Maryland to the late Annie Louise Generette and Frederick Satterfield.

Marshall spent most of his youth growing up in Cherry Hill. He was educated in the public schools of Baltimore City. He graduated from Cherry Hill Elementary and Middle School. Marshall was a proud 1967 graduate of Carver Vocational Technical High School. After graduating from high school, Marshall sought employment at Bethlehem Steel Sparrows Point, Maryland. While at Bethlehem Steel, he completed a four year Electrical Apprentice program becoming an Electrical Technician for over 22 years. After leaving Bethlehem Steel, Marshall worked for the City of Baltimore in the Human Service Division of Housing. He joined Century 21 Associates as a License Real Estate Agent for over 10 years.

Marshall's early Christian experience began at Simmons Memorial Baptist Church. He was baptized at the age of 15 by the late Rev. William King. In his youth, Marshall was a member of the Junior Choir and Junior Ushers. As an adult, Marshall, held the position of vice chairmen of the Trustee Board at Simmons Memorial Baptist Church for many years.
