

The life and legacy of Alfrella Evelyn Ryals began on August 23, 1971, in Miami, Florida, as a beautiful baby girl to Ernell Zelner and Alfred Ryals Sr. She graduated from Douglas Anderson School of the Arts in 1990. After moving from Jacksonville, Florida, to Detroit, Michigan, she earned an AA degree in Education from Henry Ford Community College. Alfrella went on to teach at The Pentecostal Church of God Christian Academy in Detroit, Michigan.

Alfrella's devotion to education and the Church was evident throughout her life. She inspired many students through her passion for learning and her nurturing spirit, always encouraging those around her to pursue their dreams and reach their fullest potential by trusting in the word of God. Her faith and dedication made a lasting impact on everyone she encountered, both in the classroom and beyond.

Alfrella first and foremost loved the Lord our God, Jesus Christ, with all her heart, all her soul, and all her mind, confident that her eternity was with God. She often said, if God decided to come and take her home, she would be ready.
