In the early morning on Wednesday, June 15, 2022, she completed her earthly journey, and now receives her much deserved sweet rest.

Evon is the youngest among six children born to Ezell and Vennie Lee Morris. Her life was touched by the Lord as a young girl. She served under the pastoral leadership of Bishop Marcus L. Butler, Pastor of the Amazing Institutional Church of God in Christ for more than fifty years. She loved the choir and the ministries of the church. She never wanted to miss a church service. Evon attended Forest Hill High School, Hinds Community College and Jackson State University.

United in matrimony to Mr. Leandrew Mayberry for forty-three years, they were blessed with two daughters; and now two sons-in-law and two adorable grandchildren round out the family.

Evon was diagnosed with Stage 4 Renal failure in 2005. Such a diagnosis may cause some to fall into hopelessness and despair. This was not the case for her. She provided critical care to her elderly mother and daughter in their illnesses despite her own debilitating health. Her faith never wavered. She did not faint.
