Remembering ALEAN WILLIAMS

On August 6, 1939, in Haynesville, Louisiana (Caddo Parish), Arlester Williams and Idella (Oliver) Williams welcomed their baby girl, Alean Williams. She accepted Christ as her Lord and Savior at an early age at Ward Chapel, beginning a lifelong journey of faith and service.

In 1954, Alean married Roosevelt Brown, and together they welcomed four children. As a young mother, Alean moved with her children from Haynesville, Louisiana to Houston, Texas. Shortly after arriving, she united with New Bethel Missionary Baptist Church while working diligently in private homes as a caterer, housekeeper, and nanny. She later gained employment with Methodist Hospital, continuing her commitment to caring for others.

After several years, she joined Antioch Missionary Baptist Church, now Southeast Community Church, where she served faithfully for more than 50 years. Throughout her time at Southeast Community Church, Sister Williams was a devoted member of numerous ministries, including the Choir, Invitational Counselors, J.A.S.A., Prayer Warriors, the Usher Board, Hoppers and Rockers Ministry, and the Hospitality Ministry. Her warm spirit and servant's heart touched countless lives.

Desiring to further her education, Sister Williams earned her General Education Diploma in her mid-fifties and continued her studies at Houston Community College, completing the program to become a Certified Nursing Assistant. This achievement opened the door for her to work as a private-duty Certified Nursing Assistant for nearly 30 years, a role that perfectly aligned with her passion for caring for others.

Sister Williams was preceded in death by her parents, Arlester and Idella Williams; her siblings John Williams, Mary L. Turner, and Earnestine Williams; her children Barbara G. Brown and Roosevelt Brown Jr.; her grandchildren Ernest W. Monmouth and Patrick Williams; and her great-granddaughter Shadaria Miles.
