

Eric spent most of his childhood in Cedar Rapids, IA. Following his teenage years, he took further schooling in carpentry and then lived in many places including: Iowa, Florida, Canada, Sioux Falls, and more. Eric worked different jobs, several of those were as a cook; he was a wonderful cook. He has fond memories of living with his brother in Florida. He came to Milbank and worked construction and painting jobs with many different companies (Pillatzke and Montag/Wallworks) before starting his own company, Finish Pros, where he specialized in painting and sheetrock taping, among other tasks. After an injury at his job, Eric joined Whetstone Lumber as the yard manager. 
