Life Reflections

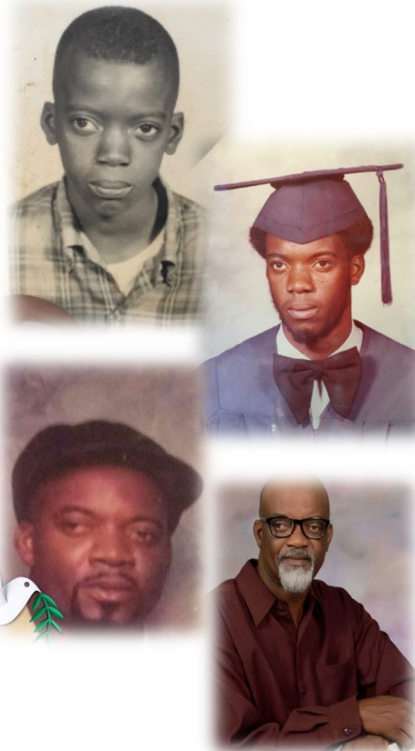
Ray Charles Ferguson was born June 8, 1958, to Ray and Lula Mae Ferguson.
