Ada C. McCrumm Gaither, beloved wife, mother, sister, grandmother and friend, passed away, May 10, 2021. She was 77 years old.

Ada C. Cornish was born to Mildred V. Corporal Cornish and James O' Brien Cornish on June 16, 1943, in Coatesville, PA. She was the wife of Curtis F. Gaither with whom she shared 15 years of marriage.

She was educated in the Coatesville Area School District.
