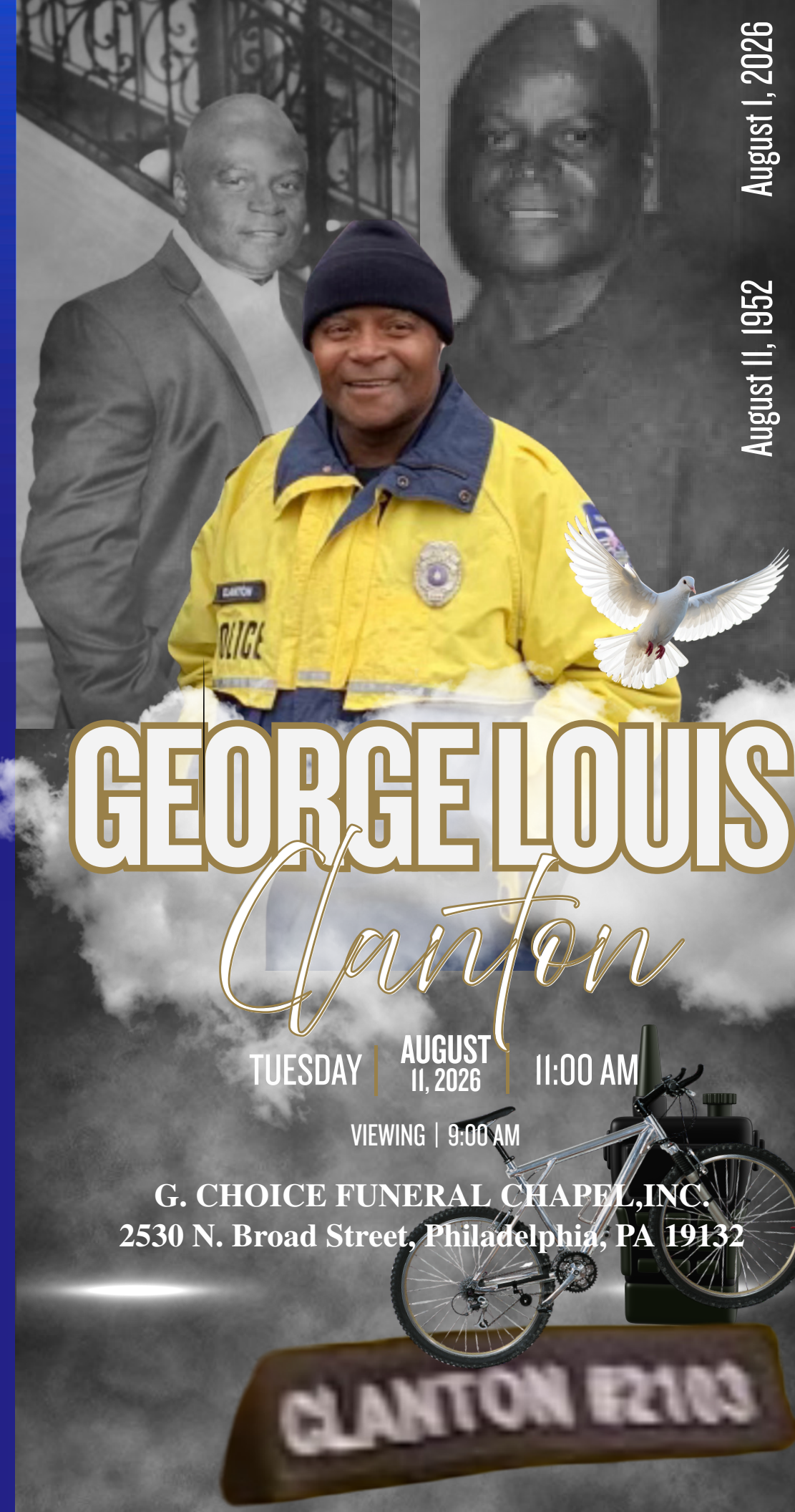

His favorite part was being on bike patrol were he was able to be more involved with the students and the community. He was well known and could be spotted through out the campus. In his later years, George continued to persue education attending Drexel University and completed his education at Temple University receiving his Bachelor’s in Accounting in 2006. George received an Appreciation of 25 years of service in 2016. George later retired as a Temple University Police Officer in 2022 after 31 years.

George liked hanging with his friends from work and going on trips. He loved to eat! He loved lifting weights and staying in shape. Watching TV, going to the movies. he liked being on bike patrol.

One of his greatest accomplishments was being a grandfather. Though he was short in stature he was a giant in the hearts of his grandchildren.
