Obituary



Marian Louise Evains, 87, of Ocean Township, NJ, passed away on Thursday, May 5, 2022 at Jersey Shore University Medical Center located in Neptune, NJ. Marian was born on December 19th, 1934 in the county of Sumter, SC to Arthur and Bessie Hartwell. At the age of eight, Marian and her family moved to Asbury Park, NJ.

Marian was educated in the Asbury Park School system, graduating from Asbury Park High School in 1952. Upon graduating, she was employed by the United States Government first working at Camp Evans in Wall, NJ, then at the Signal Corps Unit, which was housed in the HEXAGON building located in Tinton Falls NJ, and last for the Communications-Electronics Command (CECOM) also located in Tinton Falls NJ, retiring with over 30 plus years of service. While employed by the Federal Government, she also obtained an Associate Degree from Brookdale Community College, and a Bachelor's Degree from Kean College, now known as Kean University, in Early Childhood Education.
