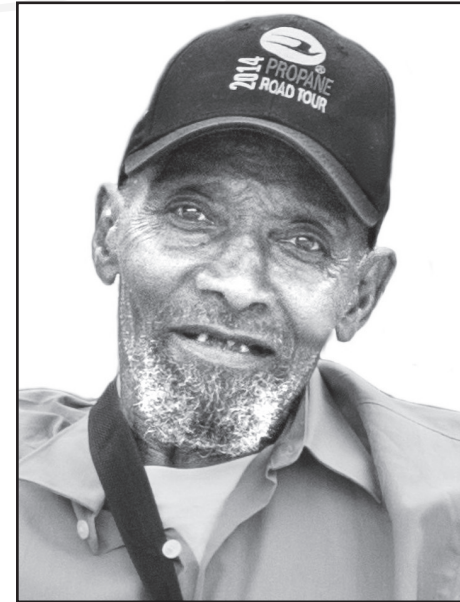

James Edward Guda, 80, of Tinton Falls, New Jersey passed away in Jersey Shore University Medical Center on July 3, 2019. He was born on October 29, 1938 to Alphonso and Pauline (Pollyanna Mitchell) Guda in New York City.

Following the untimely death of his father when he was only a year old, James and his mother moved into an apartment with his mother’s sister, Mary Mitchell. They eventually moved to New Jersey and settled in the Red Bank/Middletown, New Jersey area.

He graduated from Middletown High School where he excelled academically and ran track. Although he never attended, he was awarded an athletic scholarship to run track in college. He worked for the United States Postal Service for many years, and also drove a school bus.
