

Donald W. Redd, 93, passed away peacefully on May 10, 2015. Don was born on March 29, 1922 in Blanding, Utah to Ancil Rey & Louise Ann Elliott Redd. Growing up on a ranch, he performed many jobs at home for his widowed mother. He loved summers being a cowboy for ranchers in the area.

He graduated from San Juan H.S. After attending Dixie College, he was invited into the Navy for WWII. He served his country honorably on a mine sweeper in the Pacific.

While attending Naval classes at Cornell University, he met the love of his life, Marion Lois Middleton. They were married June 20, 1946 in Flint Michigan, and later sealed in the Salt Lake Temple. He graduated from the U of U law school and practiced law in Salt Lake City before being activated by the Navy for the Korean Conflict. 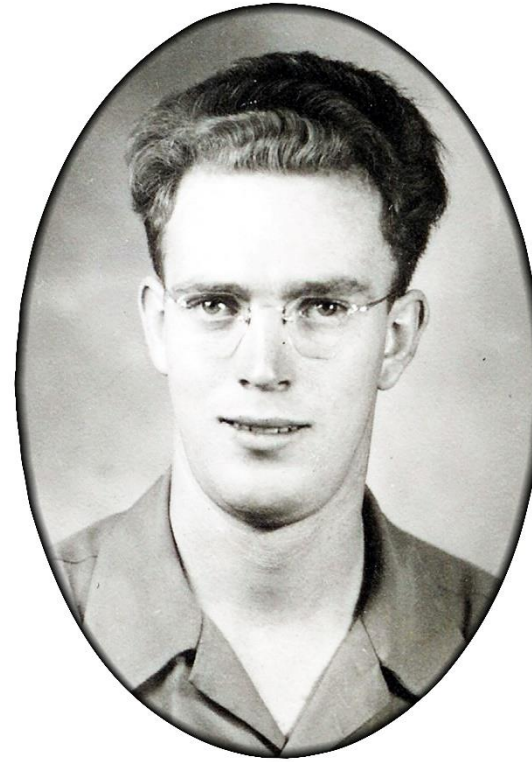
