OBITUARY

Mattie Wilson Moses was born April 2, 1946, in Dalzell, SC, to the late Joseph Sr. and Hattie Boone Wilson. She was called to heavenly rest May 16, 2026.

Early in life, she joined Mount Olive AME Church, Sumter, SC. Mattie was a dedicated and faithful servant. She served on several auxiliaries: Class Leader; Usher Board; Senior Choir; Woodrow Missionary Society; and Lay Organization. Her commitment to serving extended beyond the church. She also volunteered with Kershaw Medical Center (currently MUSC Kershaw), Camden, SC, and visited loved ones who struggled with health challenges in nursing facilities and at home.

Mattie was educated in the Lee County Public School System and graduated from Dennis High School in 1964. After working many years to care for her family, she enrolled in the adult literacy studies program at Sumter-Lee County Adult Education and received an outstanding achievement award in 2007. In June 2008, she completed the nursing assistant program at Central Carolina Technical College, Sumter, SC. She earned her nursing assistant certification in November 2008.

Mattie worked tirelessly for 17 years in manufacturing serving as a machinist with Sumter Spinning (later became

Schoeller Inc.) in Sumter, SC, until the company relocated operations out of the country. She also worked with Kendall Wateree (Camden, SC) for 7 years until layoff, and Bosch Braking Systems (Sumter, SC) until layoff. Though the layoffs were difficult, she trusted God and was motivated to press her way. Thereafter, she worked briefly as a childcare provider until her health and well-being impacted her ability to continue in the workforce.

Mattie was married to the late Josh Moses. They were blessed with four children. She was preceded in death by her baby son Samuel and three brothers, Joseph Jr., William ("Billy"), and George.

She leaves to cherish her legacy and fond memories: son Benjamin; two daughters Sheila and Sherron; granddaughter, Meghan (Olawale); grandson Jarvis; four great grandchildren: Bryce, Elijah, Kaleb, and Miracle; seven siblings: Julia Jenkins (Rembert, SC); Mary Goodman (Dallas, TX); Robert (Willie Mae) Wilson (Dalzell, SC); John Wilson (Tacoma, WA); Rose (Rodney) Murphy (San Antonio, TX); Lucious Wilson (Tyler, TX); and Willie Wilson (Dalzell, SC) as well as a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and other relatives.
