Reflections on the Life of Jimmie Ann Butler

Jimmie Ann Butler, 84 years old from Wichita KS, a loving matriarch and beacon of unwavering faith, transitioned to Glory on Friday April 17, 2026.

Jimmie Ann Butler was born April 27, 1941, in Duncan, Oklahoma to James Edward Moreland and Annie Ruth Moreland while he was stationed in Fort Sill, in Lawton Oklahoma. Jimmie, also affectionately known as Ms. Ann or Annie, was the oldest of four children and sibling to Julia Moreland McKee, Harry Moreland and Carl Moreland, Jimmie attended Dunbar Elementary, Horace Mann Jr High and North High School. Jimmie Ann was quiet, and loyal to all that she encountered.

She was united in holy matrimony to Joseph Augustus "Isaac" Nash while they were both members at Tabernacle Baptist Church in 1958. Four children were born in this union, Lawrence, Constance, Pamela, and Alan. Jimmie Ann was a stay-at-home Mom and guarded her children with her heart and unwavering love. She later was united in marriage to Grant Butler on June 19, 1970, and to this union five children were born, Anthony, Leroy, Roy, Lorraine, and Marcus. Jimmie Ann loved not only her children, but the neighborhood children, her nieces, nephews and whomever she crossed paths with. It was not uncommon to see children playing in the yard, or her home packed with 16 kids consisting of her eight kids, and eight nieces and nephews in a 4-bedroom house in Bel Aire eating, playing games, watching TV, coloring you name it she did it! Nothing but fun and the absolute best memories even today! Her household even had a protocol on Saturday mornings to perform the household chores to music! Music ranged from Classical, Gospel to Rhythm and Blues. She was an avid reader and had many books. She loved coloring books, crossword puzzles, and loved cooking. Momma could burn in the kitchen especially Peach Cobbler and German Chocolate Cake! There was never a dull moment, Jimmie Ann had countless friends and colleagues.

Jimmie Ann later made the decision to return to work after years as a stay-at-home Mom. She was employed at NCR and remained until retirement around the age of 67. She did not adjust well to retirement. She worked briefly driving a school bus picking up kids for school and eventually took on a job at Wesley Medical Center where she made more friends and memories.

Jimmie Ann was known for her sense of humor, quick wit and heart of gold who always looked out for those in need and would help when and wherever she could. Her life was a testament to resilience, faith, and an abiding love for her family. Her presence in her family's lives was a guiding force and a testament to her nurturing spirit. Jimmie Ann cherished the memories of her family and held them close to her heart, drawing strength from their shared history and love. Jimmie Ann's legacy extends beyond her immediate family, leaving an indelible mark on all who knew her. Her unwavering faith, fierce devotion to her family, and enduring kindness have left a lasting impact on the hearts she touched.
