HIS JOURNEY

Edward Earl "Nick" Generette was born to the late Lula Mae and Nicholas Generette on January 27, 1950. He was a beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend. He was also a man of faith, having confessed his belief in Christ at an early age. He later became a member of Chapel Hill M.B. Church in Yazoo City, where he was a devoted and active member.

Nick's educational journey began at St. Francis Catholic School, where he graduated as part of the class of 1967. He furthered his education at Alcorn State University in Lorman, Mississippi.

Nick made history as the first Black lineman for South Central Bell in Yazoo City, where he proudly served for 39 years before retiring. Even after his retirement, his commitment to his work and community remained strong, as he was called back to assist with relief efforts following Hurricane Katrina. A trailblazer in his field, Nick's dedication to service and his role as a mentor left a lasting impact on those who followed in his footsteps.

An avid outdoorsman, Nick had a deep love for deer hunting, a pastime he enjoyed for many years. But above all, Nick cherished spending time with his family, especially his sister, Inell Leach, and Brother-in-love, Herman Leach who preceded him in death.

Nick leaves behind a legacy of love and strength. He is survived by his devoted wife, Essie Generette; his children: Docia (Timmy) Walker, Bakari (Danyelle) Generette, Matthew Edwards, Tonesia Edwards, Valencia Edwards, Terrance Freeman, and Roger Haralson, whom he considered a bonus son; as well as nine in-law, including Matthew (Karen), Christine, Addie (Robert), William, Martin (Denise), Mary Jane (Jessie), David Lee (Cortessa), Steve (Stephanie), and Julie (Andrew). He will also be remembered fondly by his fifteen grandchildren: Thaerin, Tanija, Bryce, Z'Erra, Z'avion, Latre'via, Samuel, Romani, Mykailah, Triniti, Braelyn, Mykle, Landon, Madison, and Kennedi.
