LIFE REFLECTIONS

Committed. Every single week, every single day, every single hour, every single minute. 720 hours a month, he was committed to his purpose. His God, children, mother, step-dad, brother, sister, his job, and other family members and friends.

He knew down deep in his soul, what his purpose was, and he kept dreaming and grinding to reach for more, overcoming obstacles with prayer, and then tackling them — sometimes with the strategy of a master chess player and other times like a huge line or defensive back.

He was born with gifts 49 years ago, from a multi-talented gift bearer herself, who brought not only he, but two others with more gifts into this dimension, for all to marvel and see.

But it was he, whose energy had the roar of a lion, an electric ball of fire who simply did not know when to stop.

And, he was true to who he was. The writer Alice Walker once said that it's up to other people whether they can accept you or not; however, people accepting him didn't bother him in the least.

His motto was to stay consistent. To stay prayed up. And he would tell anyone close to him, "stay in your own lane."

"Don't try and do what everyone else is doing," he would tell aspiring colleagues, vocalists, performers, and anyone else that would come to him for business advice.

"A lot of dj's came before me, and while I thank them for giving me the blueprint, I put my own twist on what I did. And I made my name out there," he said.

And that he did. Josh Singleton kicked off his radio career in 2008 with partner Michael Turner on KBZE 105.9FM. Their program was the Fabulous Lunch Hour with DJ Fab and Mike Tyte.

They entertained the masses, through FM in 7 parishes, and worldwide on streaming radio.

Together, their vibe was unmatched, chopping it up on topics too many too list. And as he worked on the air, his night and weekend disc jockey gigs increased, performing in clubs, at weddings, office parties, picnics, you name it. He loved being an unofficial ambassador to his hometown Franklin, and his alma mater Franklin Sr High.

He enjoyed promoting health advocacy and voter awareness, and treasured relationships with many leaders in those fields.

He was King of the Krewe of Amani in 2019, and treasured every minute of his reign. It was the cherry to top the cake of his love for entertaining at Carnival Balls, which began early in his career and continued to this day. In February of 2025, he spent about a week in New Orleans to broadcast from Radio Row at the 59th Super Bowl. He was the only radio music dj from South Louisiana, outside of New Orleans, to do so.

Each summer, he enjoyed broadcasting from the Essence Music Festival in New Orleans, where he shook hands and snapped photos like a paparazzi photographer with the big ones: Patti La Belle, Mary J Blige, Raheem DeVaugh, Anthony Hamilton, Tamela and David Mann, Benjamin



Crump, Nephew Tommy, Shirley Strawberry, Shaggy, Master P, Dr Jamal Bryant, and Tiffany Haddish to name a few.

But he was more proud of his home grown musicians, and would love to work with them any chance he could get: Cupid, Roi Chip, Chris Ardoin, David Sylvester, Runt, Lysa and Tucka to name a few.

He loved it when new talent would find him, like Dani Dolce, Dem Ligon Boiz and Ado Soul.

He also had a special mentee relationships with DJs Chunchy Bell and Delvin Harrison II.

But most of all, he cherished his time on the air, over the phone and in person with his listeners and his fans.

Joshua Allorondon Singleton (aka DJ Fab) is the son of Mr. Mrs. Gregory Prince and Mr. Larry Singleton. He was born on June 15, 1977, and grew up for most of his life in Franklin, LA.

He is the father of 5 (Justin, Jylan, Journi, Legend and Reign). He has 2 siblings: Joseph (Michelle) and Martha, five nieces: Iceland, England, Harmony Melody and Micah, and one nephew, Joseph Jr. He also has a step brother, Jeffrey Prince, a Godson Denver Briscoe.

He is also survived by his Godmother, Theresa Jones, a devoted employee, Gerald "Big" Press, and his KBZE Family, Howard and Darlene Castay, "Pastor C" Lee Condolle, Sandra G, Dr O, Spider G and John Colar III.

Joshua was educated in the St. Mary Parish School System.

He began his music career at Franklin Junior High School and followed in his brother Joseph footsteps, and became a drummer.

He continued as a drummer and was Section Leader with the Franklin Senior High School marching band.

His entertainment experience was achieved and recognized by Thespian teacher, Mr. Mark Lunford. He became a thespian member and was always a character of humor. This is where he was first introduced to theatrics.

Joshua attended and was baptized at St. Joseph Baptist Church with his mom Cynthia at a very early age.

"Music is definitely in his bones, because his dad and myself were both in the music field," she said. "Josh was the drummer for several years at St. Joseph and would beat

the drums with so much vigor and energy, he was given the nickname Trooper. I scheduled him all over the community, playing the drums for choirs I directed." Cynthia said, Josh was also in the St.

Joseph Baptist Church Drama Ministry and Cynthia credits Ms. Patricia Cooper for his knowledge and love for theatrics.

Before radio and independent gigs, Josh began an earlier career with his mother and step-father as a D.J. with Prince Productions as DJ Phabolis.

Cynthia said he soon found his niche and later became an independent DJ, and changed the spelling of his name to Fabulous (DJ Fab) and became the owner and operator of Fabulous Entertainment.

"Josh was my faith child. He started out as part-time with KBZE, and then when he was offered full time, he trusted God and walked off a job in good standings with Cardinal Lumber, in pursuit of pursuing his passion, and the rest was history," Cynthia said.

Over 18 years Josh pushed all that he was to the limits, in music, and for a brief period, renting inflatable water slides and space walks to the public, while cutting yards and caring for those most dear to him.

The Zydeco Blues and Trail Ride Awards tapped him for the DJ of the Year in 2014 and the Southern Tea Awards followed with the same honor in 2019.

In 2025 the Louisiana Association of Broadcasters tapped him with the best voting coverage of a small market radio station overall in Louisiana.

And also in 2025, the Southern Tea Awards inducted him into their hall of fame representing his work as a dj for 20 years.

Dr. Martin Luther King wrote, "The ultimate measure of man is where he stands in challenge and controversy."

Joshua Singleton was that man who stood in good times and in bad, whose action spoke louder than his words.

A KBZE listener wrote, "The Legendary Fab has impacted our lives, mission completed.

He is now at his final award ceremony, where he will be given his crown. The Trumpets are now sounding off." Yes, Fab is now a legend. But his legacy will on, and his light will be an eternal flame for all of us, until we each get to see him again.
