No one can ever know.



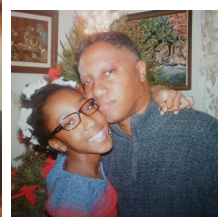
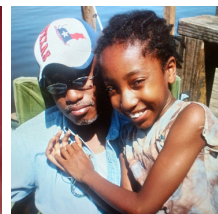
## *Brother*
