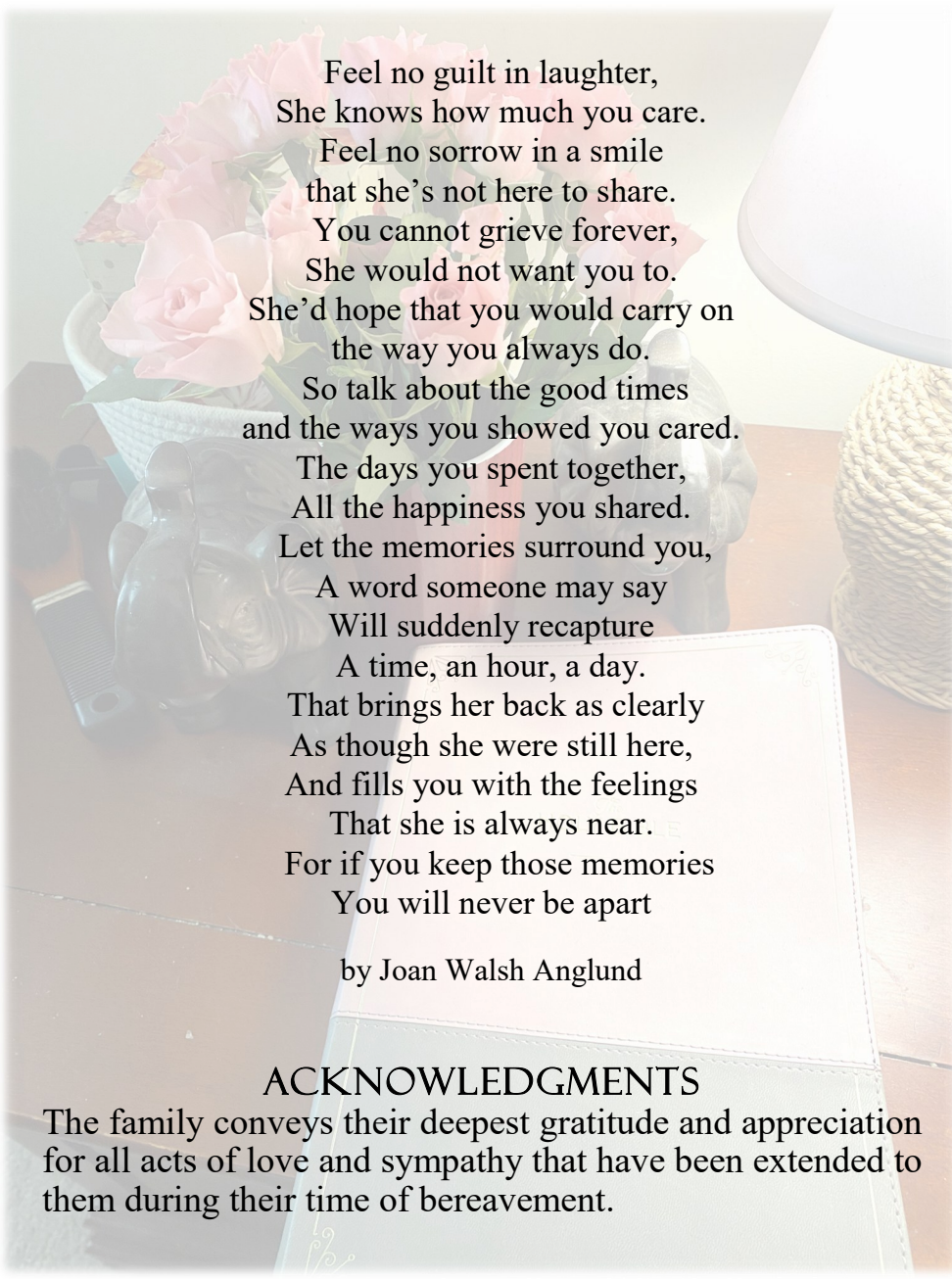




Feel no guilt in laughter,
