

A Glimpse Into Albert's Life

Albert Lee Cutts, age 70, passed away on August 17, 2025, at St. Luke's East Hospital in Lee's Summit, Missouri surrounded by his loved ones. He was the eldest of six children, born January 9, 1955, in Little Rock, Arkansas to Clyde Cutts Jr. and Rose Marie Mack-Cutts.

Albert grew up in Little Rock and graduated from Hall High School. After high school, he attended Pulaski Vocational Technical School where he received a diploma in Data Processing. After completing technical school, Albert furthered his education in Godfrey, Illinois, at Lewis and Clark Community College, where he earned an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in Information Technology.

Albert returned to Little Rock, AR, and began his career at UAMS College of Medicine as a Systems Analyst, faithfully serving for 15 years, during which he was promoted to supervisor in the IT Department.

In 1994, Albert met Audrey Burtin and on September 17, 1992, they were wed and were happily married for 30 years.


