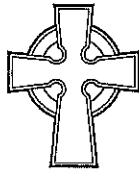

Campbellsport surrounded by his loving family.

Roger was born on June 21, 1933, in the Town of Auburn to John Sr.
and Mildred Heberer (nee Krueger). He was united in marriage to
Audrey Reuter in West Bend. Roger and Audrey were blessed with three
daughters.

He worked at RegalWare in Kewaskum from September 1952 to
August 1953. From August 1953 to August 1955, Roger served in the
United States Army. Roger went on to work for West Bend Company
from August 1955 to May 1977, then founded, owned, and operated
Heberer Brothers Construction with his brothers, Norman and Bill.
Roger retired in 1995.
