




LaDonna Marie Hill, 83, of McPherson, KS, and formerly of Salina, KS, peacefully passed away on Monday, January 20, 2025, surrounded by her family at her home.

She was born March 26, 1941, in Minneapolis, KS, the daughter of Samuel LeRoy and Inez Marie (Goodall) Schlotz. On September 28, 1957, LaDonna was united in marriage to Garland Elmo Hill, Jr. in Salina, KS. This union was blessed with four children, Garland, III, Sonia, Sally, and Sean. LaDonna and Garland were married for 66 years prior to his passing on October 28, 2023.

LaDonna retired in 2004 from McPherson Hospital where she was a dietary clerk for over 25 years. She attended New Life Foursquare Church and was a former member of Grace Bible Church. She was also a member of the Christian Motorcycle Association and volunteered at Save N' Share.

LaDonna always wanted a big house. So, in 1970, they bought their forever home on Grimes. She was a homemaker and made their house into a home. She loved her flower garden. Even though she worked full-time and raised four children, she made time to do crafts: sewing clothes for the kids and the girl's dolls, crocheting afghans, ponchos and stocking caps, cross stitching Christmas stockings for each child and grandchild, knitting and embroidery and needlepoint. She was known for her fabulous cooking.

Some of her accomplishments later in life were that she got her GED in 1975 and took business, accounting and psychology college courses. She learned to swim. After her children were grown, LaDonna and Garland joined the Christian Motorcycle Association and traveled across the United States, Canada and Mexico. They even took a cruise to Alaska with friends. They saw all the natural wonders of Continental America by truck, motorcycle, travel trailer, railroad, plane, paddle boat, rubber raft or tour bus. When her traveling days were over, she enjoyed time with family and friends, became immersed in genealogy, volunteered at the Save N' Share store and joined a lady's exercise group at the senior center. LaDonna was a woman of great faith and prayer. She was an asset to any church she attended. She will be greatly missed.
