

Psalm 23

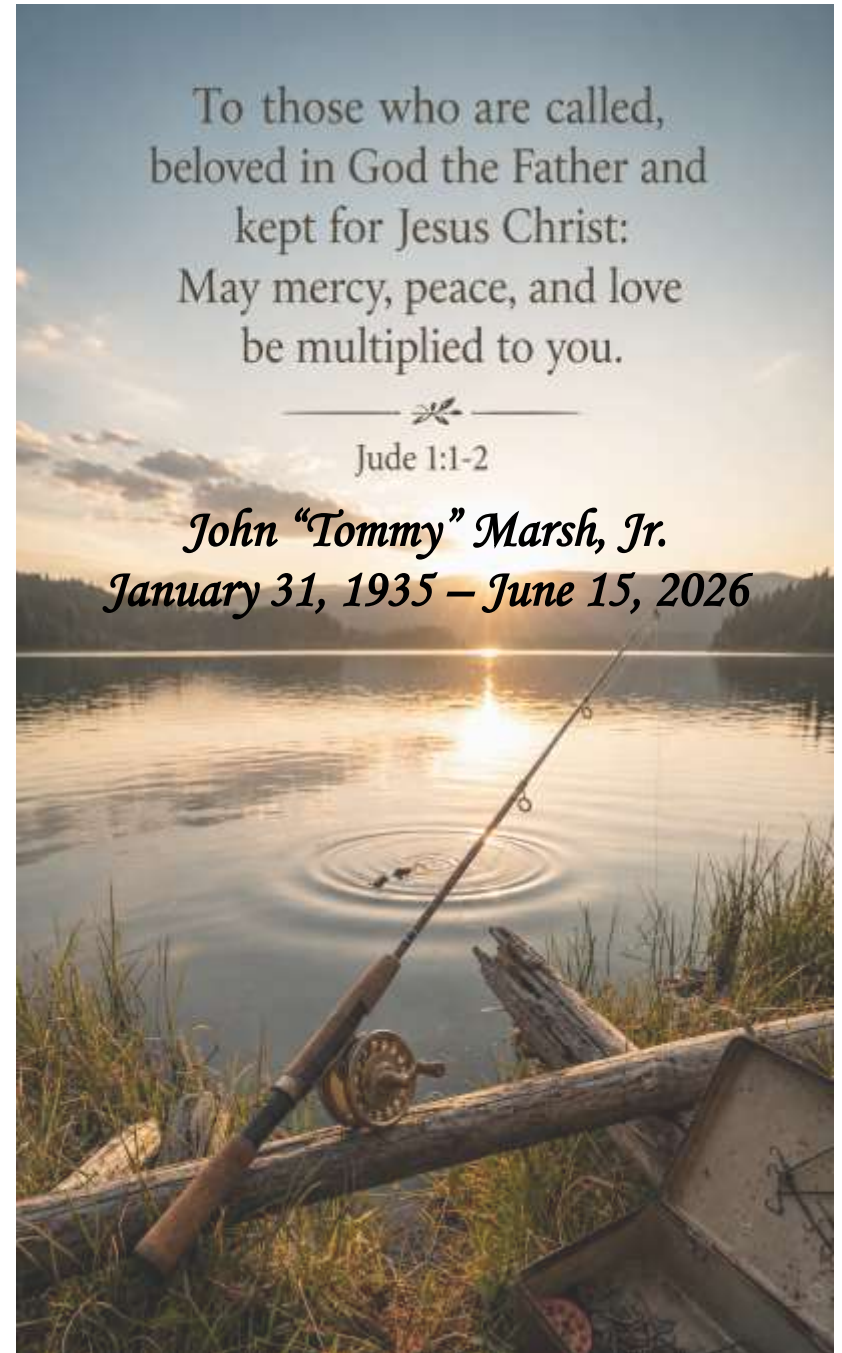
