

Milton graduated from Richard Arnold High School, and worked over 35 years as a truck driver with the last employment with SLG Logistics. Milton served in the Army reserves during his lifetime.

He became a Deacon at Christian Way Holiness Church on August 23, 2015.

Milton is the 16th child of 19 children born to the late Bishop Earnest and Daisy Williams. He was raised in Church, taught about God, and how to sing at an early age by his parents. He also was inspired by his older siblings that sing in Gospel groups. He grew up to become one of the most gifted singers of all time. He was truly blessed and gifted in music and made sure he gave his gifts back to the Lord. Milton used his talents to sing the gospel with several quartet groups. His finale as a quartet singer was with Deacon Roland McCarr and the Gospel Travelers where Milton, his youngest son Logan, and his brother Leonard were all members. A group that is well known not only in Georgia but, in several states.

Milton was also a family comedian. As a child Milton would come up with different characters, stories and songs that would keep everyone entertained. In his later years we were all introduced to Chester, Me, and Cry baby. He found pleasure in bringing joy and laughter to others even when he wasn't feeling his best. He was a man that loved his family and would often echo the words of his late father Bishop Earnest Williams "Keep Peace".

Milton will never be forgotten for all the love he portrayed to family, friends, coworkers, and anyone he encountered in life. He was a man of integrity, respect, and humbleness. When someone called, he would always answer, willing to help in any way possible. Know matter what he experienced in life, rather good, bad, or sickness. He would always reiterate "I won't complain, because God is good to me". His motto was "Trust God".
