While earning his college degree, Eddie enjoyed a successful career in sales, working for the Wolpin Company and Melody Farms.

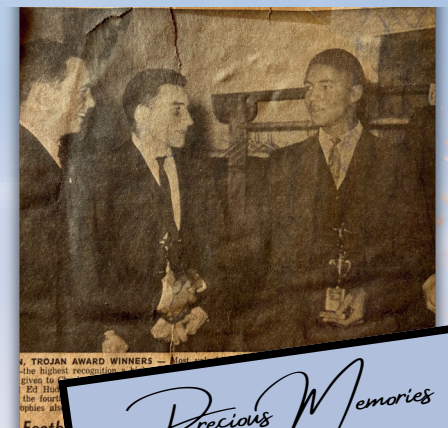
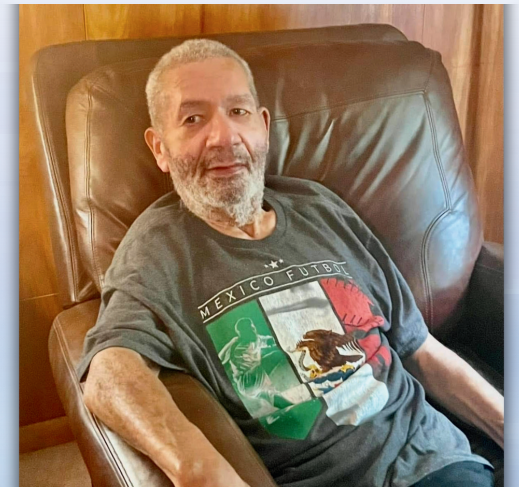
