But you're forever in my heart

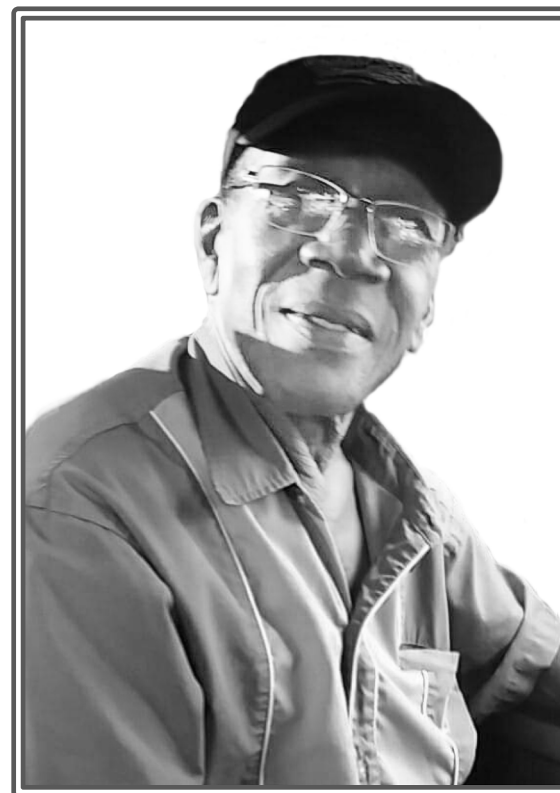
