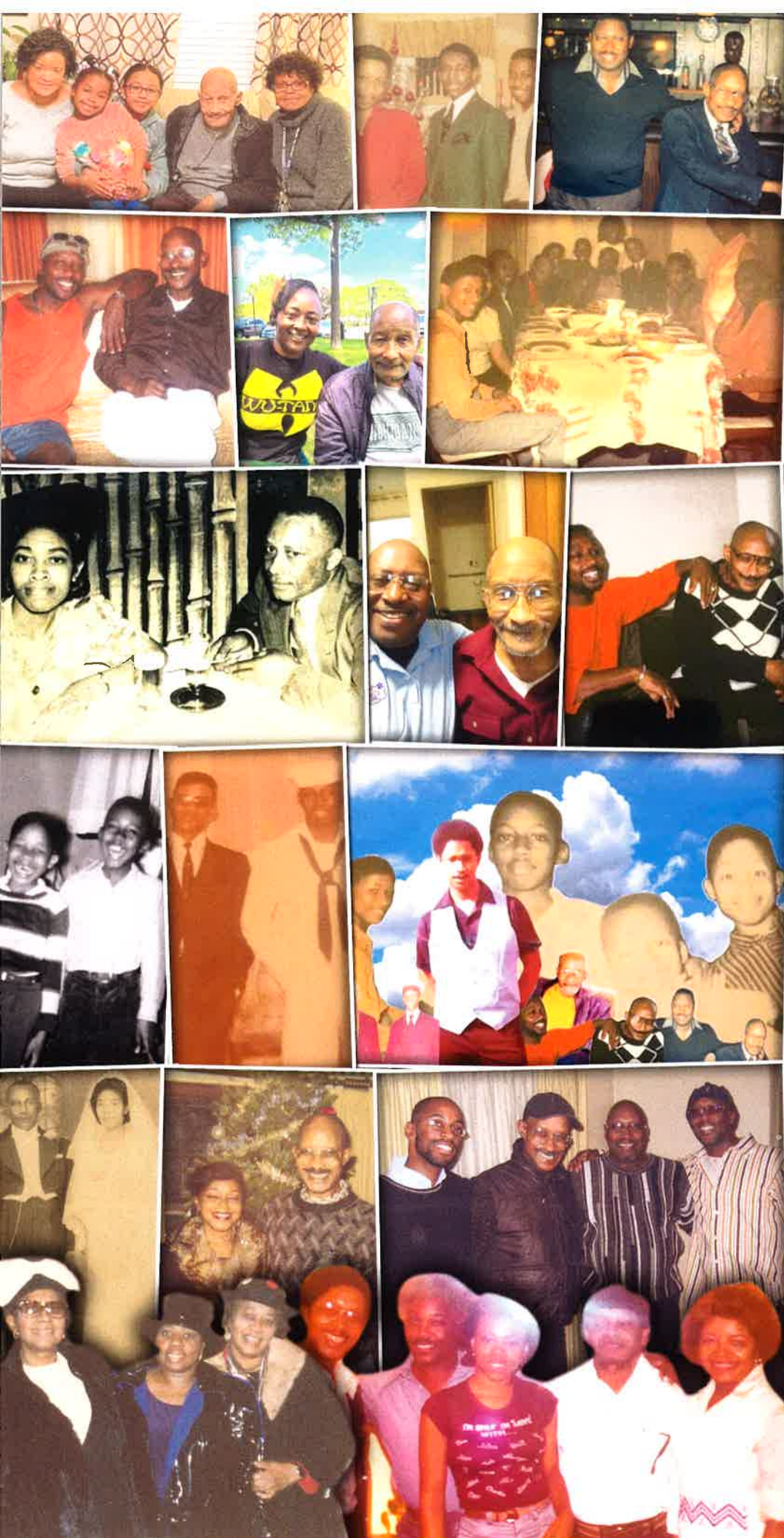

Kevelin Charles Sanders was the second child of three boys, born to the union of the late Eddie and Estelle Sanders in Detroit, Michigan, on January 4, 1951.

Kevelin accepted Christ at an early age. He attended Second Baptist Church with his father, and he also attended Zion Congregational Church of God in Christ with his mother.

Kevelin was educated in the Detroit Public School system, where he attended McCullough Elementary School, Durfee Middle School, and Mumford High School.

As a boy, Kevelin and his older brother, Curtis, were in the Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts. He loved camping and cookouts. Kevelin also loved baseball and football. Baseball was his favorite sport. As a kid, he was always the first to be picked when teams were being formed in the neighborhood. Every Sunday and Wednesday, Kevelin and Curtis would go roller-skating at the Arcadia Roller Rink on Woodward Avenue. He was an excellent skater.

Early in life, Kevelin was employed with Ford Motor Company. Later, he worked in the medical profession at Madonna Nursing Home as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA).

At an early age, Kevelin became the "man of the house" due to his mother's illness and his older brother, Curtis, serving in the United States Navy. Kevelin helped care for his mother and younger brother Lowell.

Family gatherings were Kevelin's favorite times. He loved July 4th, Thanksgiving and Christmas. He loved dressing up wearing his new outfits when he was going to the Motown Revue during Christmas, Motown music was his favorite, especially the Temptations' songs.

Kevelin had a loving and giving spirit toward family and friends. If you were in need of anything that he could provide, he would provide without hesitation. In his last days, Kevelin kept a smile and his sense of humor.
