Grows stronger now we're apart

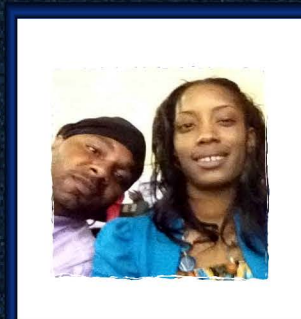
I know I can't bring you back

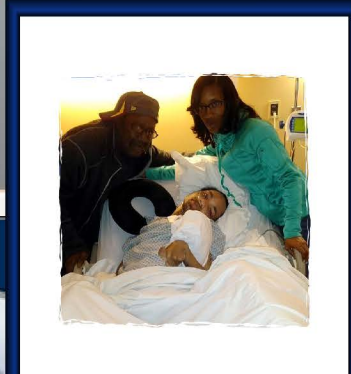
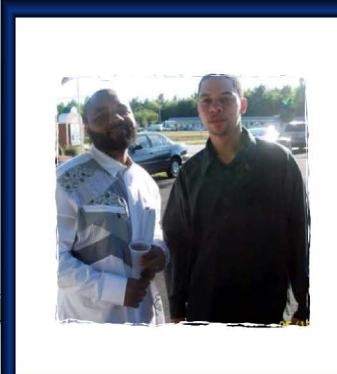
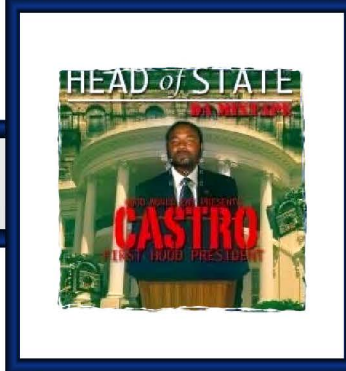
