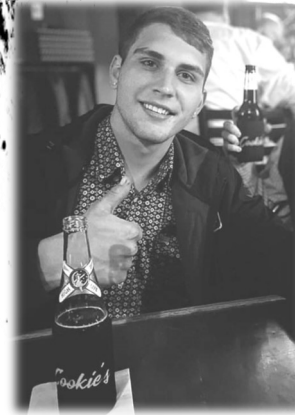

DON'T CRY FOR ME

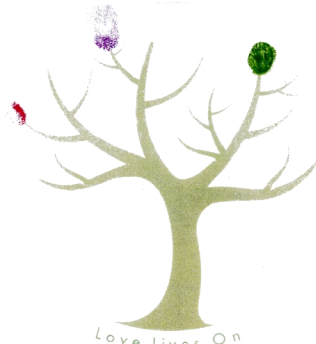
Don't cry for me. I will be okay.
