# *Helen Marie Ewing*

Helen Marie Ewing, 85, of Sedalia, MO, passed away on Wednesday, November 12, 2025, at Bothwell Regional Health Center in Sedalia. She was born on April 26, 1940, in Hutchinson County, SD, the daughter of Edward H. Vining and Martha M. (Wudel) Vining, who preceded her in death.

On November 30, 1958, at First Lutheran Church in Mitchell, SD, Helen was united in marriage to Glen Ewing, who resides in the home.

Helen attended Worthen #4 School until the 8th grade, when she moved with her family to a farm in Plano Township northeast of Mitchell, SD. She graduated from Plano High School in May 1958 and began working at the ASC office in Mitchell shortly thereafter.
