About the one that got away



*A proud veteran of the United States Air Force, Bob served from December 9, 1968, to January 4, 1973, during which time he earned both the National Defense Service Medal and the Air Force Good Conduct Medal. After retiring from his career as a land surveyor, he embraced his love for fishing as a boat captain for the Franklin County High School Fishing Team. His appreciation for Western movies and literature shaped his adventurous spirit, and he often found inspiration in the rugged tales of the past.
