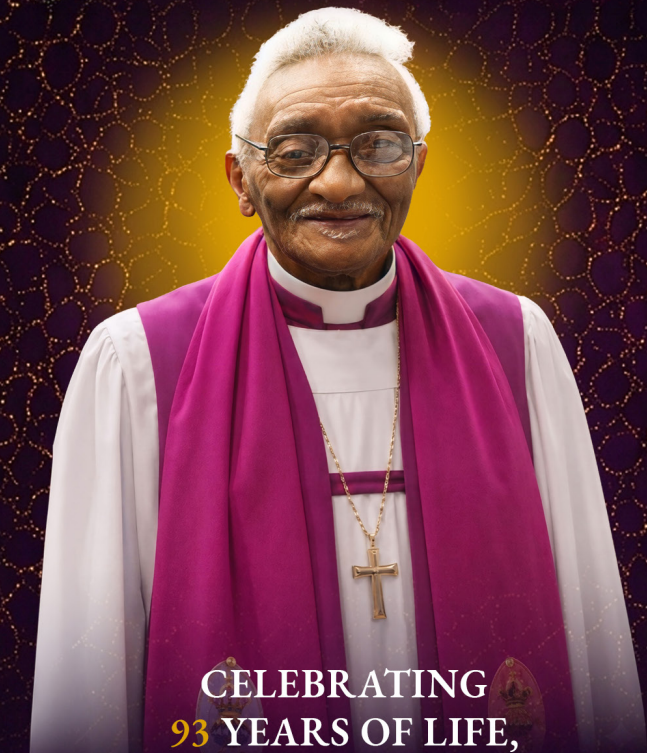

## A LIFE WELL LIVED

Bishop Elbert Edward "E.E." Webber was born on August 6, 1932, to Thomas Oscar Webber and Bertha Webber. From the beginning, his life reflected the hand of God and a calling that would later impact generations through faith, ministry, leadership, and service.

Bishop Webber was raised with strong values of faith, family, and perseverance that helped shape the man he would become. Throughout his life, he carried a deep love for God and a commitment to serving others, qualities that became evident to all who knew him.

He was preceded in death by his beloved siblings, Curtis Willie Webber, Florence Mamie Hite, and Maralee Elizabeth Webber Green.

Bishop Webber and Emma Wheaton Webber joined together in marriage and shared a beautiful union rooted in faith, love, and devotion. Together they built a strong family foundation that continues through generations.

He was also preceded in death by his beloved children, Elbert Edward Webber Jr. ("Booby"), Curtis Wesley Webber, and Cametta Webber Wilson.

Left to cherish his precious memories and continue his legacy are his loving children: Veronica Webber, Steven Webber, Regina Webber, Renee Webber, Michael Webber Sr., Darwin Webber, and Donna Webber; along with a multitude of grandchildren, great-grandchildren, great-great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins, extended family members, and many spiritual sons and daughters in Christ.

Bishop E.E. Webber also honorably served his country in the United States Army during the Korean War. During his years of service, he served as a Sergeant, a cook, a mechanic, a sharp shooter and a demolition specialist, carrying out his responsibilities with dedication and discipline. His military journey included experiences that tested his strength, character, and faith. Through challenges and adversity, he remained steadfast, later sharing how even difficult seasons became part of God's plan for his life. During this season he continued pursuing education and spiritual growth, experiences that would later shape his ministry and testimony.

## LIFE, LEGACY AND THE JOURNEY

Bishop Webber devoted 81 years of his life to ministry, serving faithfully and impacting generations through preaching, evangelism, mentorship, leadership, and unwavering dedication to the Kingdom of God.

Bishop Webber's spiritual journey began at an early age and quickly revealed a divine calling upon his life. At just 12 years old, he was filled with the Holy Ghost in his bedroom, and that very same night God called him to preach. This powerful encounter would become the beginning of a lifelong journey of faith and purpose.

At 15 years old, during a service in Topeka, Kansas, the late Bishop Charles Harrison Mason (founder of The Church of God In Christ) laid hands upon him and spoke prophetic words over his life, declaring that he would have a ministry like his if he stays humble. That evening became a defining moment in Bishop Webber's life. Under the leadership of his pastor, Father Jackson, he was called forward and received his ministry license, marking another milestone in what would become a remarkable journey of faith and service.

Bishop Webber often recalled that his pastor said, "If Bishop Mason felt you were worth enough for him to lay hands on you, then you're worthy enough to receive your ministry license." Moved by the moment, Father Jackson called for

his ministry license to be issued that very same night. Bishop Webber would later fondly remember one small detail from that life-changing evening – he often said, "It was really cold that night."

Throughout his life, Bishop Webber became widely known and respected in both the Church of God in Christ and later within the United Church of God in Christ. Under the leadership of Bishop Marshall Carter, he was a Bishop in the United Church of God in Christ. In his later years, he faithfully served as an Executive Board Member under the leadership of Bishop Aaron B. Lackey Sr. He also served as the Oklahoma State Evangelist, COGIC under Bishop Hearn and National Evangelist, UCOGIC under Bishop Marshall Carter. Bishop Webber ministered during the eras of influential church leaders including Bishop J.O. Patterson Sr., and Bishop G.E. Patterson. He worked alongside numerous respected leaders throughout his years of ministry.

Bishop Webber was known across the nation and beyond as a powerful preacher, a dedicated servant leader, and a man of wisdom whose life touched countless souls. His influence reached generations of pastors, bishops, churches, and families.

Above all titles and accomplishments, Bishop Webber was a man of faith, family, and conviction. His life reflected humility, sacrifice, and steadfast commitment to the call God placed upon him.

His legacy continues through his family, spiritual sons and daughters, countless lives transformed through ministry, and the many communities he faithfully served.
