Joyce Yvonne Cranfill, 94, of Smithton, MO, passed away on Tuesday, August 13, 2024, at her home. She was born on May 10, 1930, in Springfield, IL, the daughter of Guy Emerson Kinner and Dorothy (Swingle) Kinner, who preceded her in death.

She was united in marriage to Robert Paul Cranfill on December 31, 1951, in Sedalia, MO, who preceded her in death on May 5, 2023.

Joyce attended elementary school in Concordia, MO, and graduated from Smith-Cotton High School in 1948.
