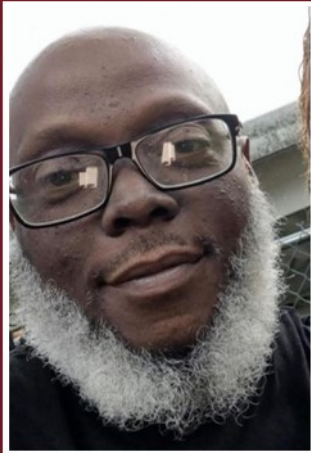


FOREVER IN MY HEART

(To My Son)

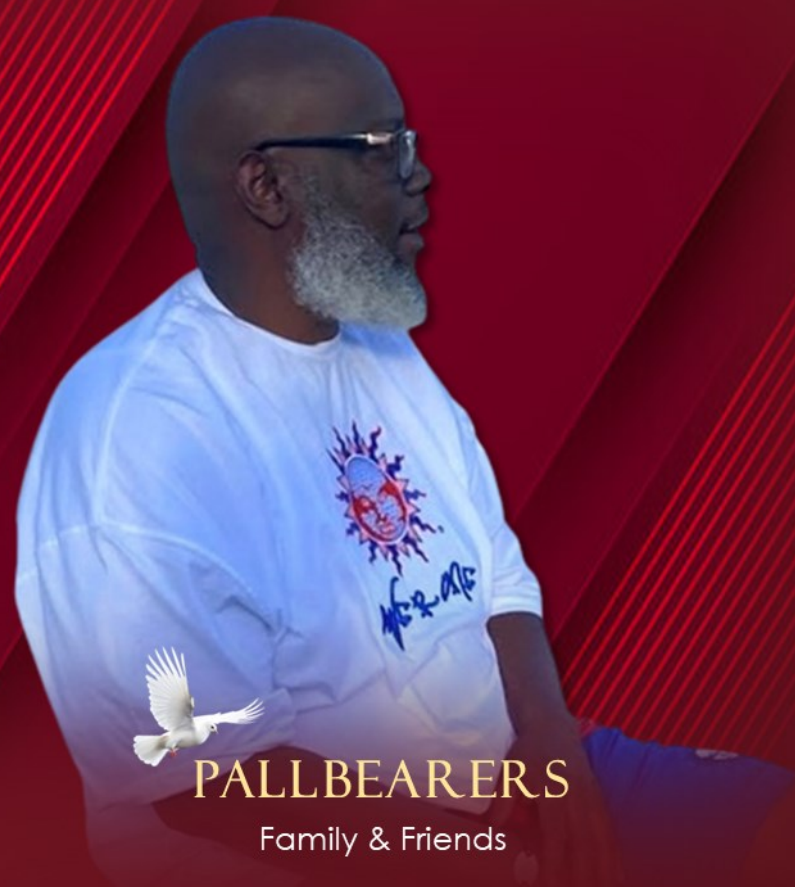
A life of love, of joy, of care,

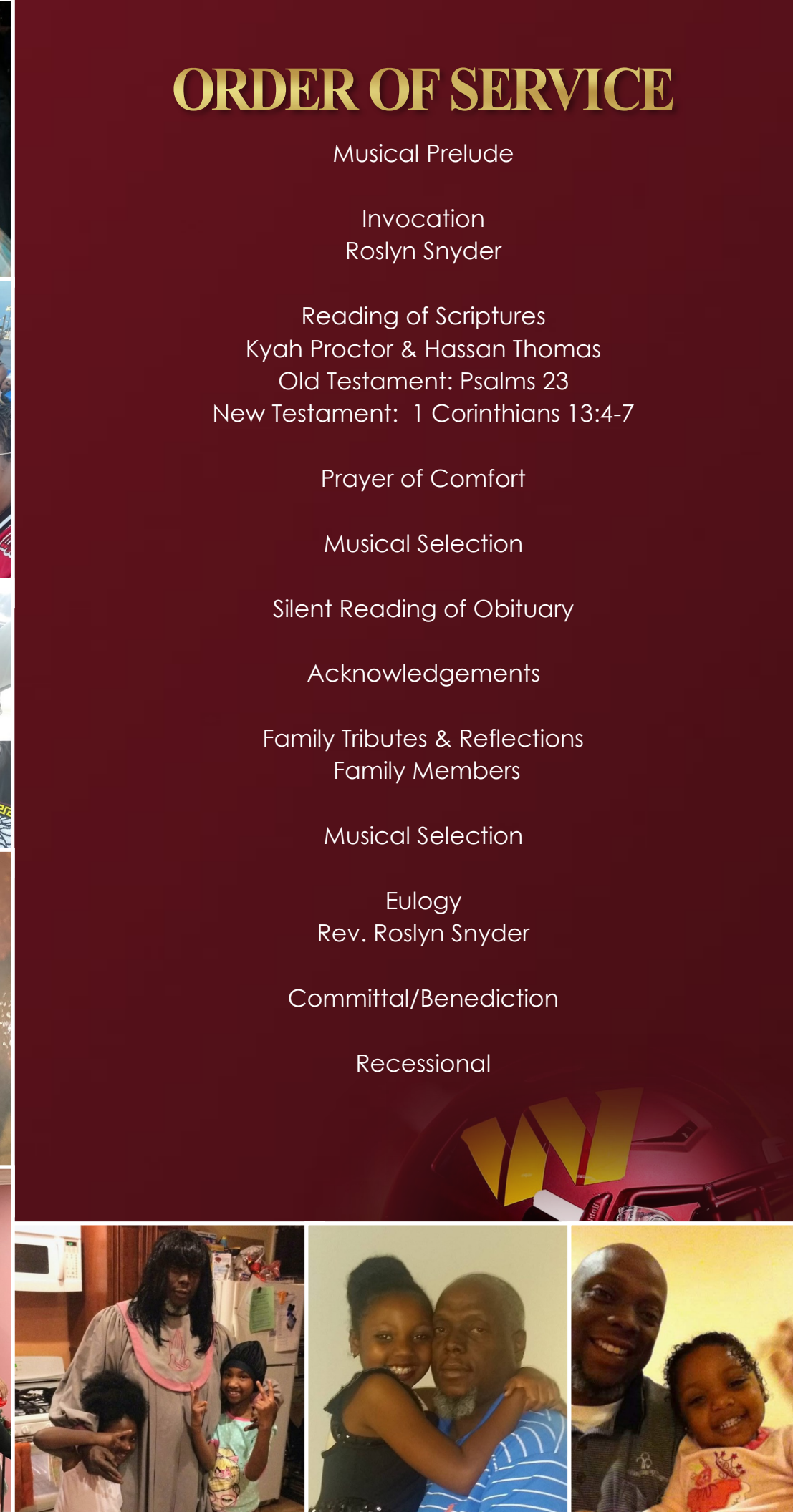
