Life Reflections

Daisy F. Sargeant, 87, Boston, Massachusetts passed away peacefully on January 8, 2024.

Daisy was born on September 23, 1936 to Clarice and Elliot Boxill in St. George, Barbados, West Indies. She was the oldest of 12 children.

After marrying Robert Sargeant in 1959 and starting a family, she traveled to the United States in 1968 in pursuit of a better life for her husband and five children.

Daisy received her associate degree in nursing from Quincy Junior College in Quincy, MA and continued her education by pursuing further studies at Roxbury Community College in Roxbury, MA.

For over 40 years, Daisy worked in nursing care at various hospitals and numerous other healthcare facilities including Beth Israel Hospital, Lemuel Shattuck Hospital and Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. After retiring as a medical professional, Daisy worked for 10 years as a school crossing guard under the auspices of the Boston Police Department System before retiring at age 78.

She was deeply committed to serving others and would often shop for groceries and cook for those who were sick and shut in. Daisy also provided financial support to relatives and friends. She enjoyed a good laugh and good food, and liked to take walks, and bike ride through Franklin Park. She was an avid fan of WWE professional wrestling and could not be convinced that wrestlers were acting.
